Brain Injury Awareness & Prevention Poster Contest Criteria for Judging

GUIDELINES

- 1. Theme: Brain Injury Awareness and Prevention message that shows either:
 - an understanding of the seriousness and consequence of brain injury
 - awareness of the causes of brain injury
 - means of preventing brain injury

2. Posters may have a combination of the ideas above.

3. Media: Entries may be produced using; crayons, pencil crayons, or markers. Computergenerated posters are not acceptable.

4. Use of copyright and/or or trademarked material will not be accepted. For example: Disney characters.

5. Entries must be free-hand artwork and printing without the use of stencils.

6. Entries will be judged on message (theme), attractiveness, clarity, and use of media.

THERE ARE FOUR CATEGORIES

Grades: One - Two Grades Three - Four Grades: Five - Six Grades Seven - Eight

MEDIA

Entries may be produced in any media that the entrants are comfortable with; crayons, pencil crayons, or markers. (Not computer generated)

Please note: Remember that these entries will be folded or rolled up and mailed to the Provincial Judges should they win at local level, so media that will crack or fall apart is not recommended.

PAPER

Entries should not be smaller than 8"x 10" or larger than 14"x 18" or thereabouts (whatever art paper measures). Please no poster board.

Please note: We cannot accept copyright material, for example no use of Disney figures.

ALL PRINTING AND ARTWORK MUST BE FREE-HAND

REMINDER

Judging will be based on presentation of a clear message about Brain Injury: showing: a) an understanding of seriousness and the consequences or b) awareness of the causes or c) means of prevention

Please have entrants mark clearer on the **BACK** of their entry their <u>first and last name</u>, <u>grade and city or town</u>.

The students' imagination and artistic skills always amazes us and we are so looking forward to seeing the entries for this year.
